Summer Camp 2020 Operations

Pre-Camp Health Screening

Self-monitor for 14 days prior to camp with document provided by Amherst Rec. Document must be turned it at the beginning of the camp week in order to attend camp.

- Self-screening for the presence of symptoms (fever of 100.4 °F or greater, cough, shortness of breath, diarrhea, fatigue, headache, muscle aches, nausea, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, vomiting, etc.)
- Determining if, within the past two weeks, the individual has traveled nationally or internationally.
- Determining if the individual has been in close contact with a person who has been diagnosed with, tested for, or quarantined as a result of COVID-19

Pre-existing Medical Conditions

We do not administer medication at camp. If there is hesitation about the camper, or a member of the household, parents are strongly recommended to consider not having child attend camp this season

Drop Off/Pick Up Operations

Drop Off (9am-9:30am)

- 1. Parents and child wait in the car while in drop off line
- 2. Drive up to the circle
- 3. 1 staff member takes and records temperature while child remains in the car. Staff member records any day-of symptoms of camper and members of the household
- 4. *Assuming camper is clear to attend camp*, Camper exits car with all belongings and is directed to the door of their group
- 5. Staff member wearing PPP during Drop Off
- 6. Notes for parents
 - o High-risk individuals should not participate in the drop-off/ pick up process
 - Limit number of extra patrons in the car as much as possible

Pick Up (3:30pm-4:00pm)

- 1. Parent will enter circle same as drop off
- 2. Staffers will call kids out of their group to head to their car
- 3. Staff member wearing PPE

Parent role in Drop off/Pick Up

- Abide by the drop off and pick up schedule
- Be diligent with monitoring signs and symptoms at home. Report accurately to camp staff
- Wash hands before leaving the house
- Minimize the amount of time used for saying goodbye to campers
- Say goodbye close to or inside your vehicle.
- Designate one parent/guardian to pick up and drop off campers every day.
- Individuals who are at higher-risk should not drop off or pickup campers.
- Allow for campers to wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds or use alcoholbased hand sanitizer containing at least 60% alcohol upon return home.
- Teach and practice good respiratory hygiene/cough etiquette within the household.
- Call with questions instead of asking during drop off/pick up

Daily Operations

Staff Safety PPE

- PPE will be made available to staff
- Everyday staff will be given the same signs and symptoms assessment as campers
- Staff should wear face coverings when within 6 ft of campers
- Campers will not be required to wear face coverings: The American Academy of Pediatrics does not recommend children to wear face coverings

Groups & Activities

- Campers and counselors will be organized by week into "groups" that eat, wash, and do all activities within the group
- Each group will have their own restroom, activity equipment, and indoor space
- Groups will not interact at camp
- Campers will participate in games, arts and crafts and outdoor activities. We will do our best to add social distancing measures to each activity.

Cleaning Operations

- Daily cleaning will be conducted with a bleach solution
 - Before camp, during camp, and end of the day procedures in place for all facilities and equipment
- Hand sanitizer will be available to campers and staff
- Staff will oversee proper and frequent handwashing of campers

Suspected Illness During Camp

• If camper or staff is suspected to have COVID-19 based on signs & symptoms assessment, individual will be isolated, and parents/guardians will be contacted for immediate pick up

Confirmed Case Operation

• If there is a confirmed COVID-19 case from camper or staff member, the facility will close for 5 days
